### New officer elections

We're sad to say goodbye to the section's outgoing officers **Prof. Jeremy Field, Dr. Elva Robinson and Dr. Eamonn Mallon** who stepped down from their roles as President, Treasurer and Secretary at the end of 2012. Many thanks to each for their contribution over the past three years, and we look forward to their continuing active participation in the society. Following the new officer elections at the Winter Meeting 2012, **Dr. Mark Brown** will take over as President. Mark is well known for his research on both the evolutionary ecology of host-parasite interactions, and on insect conservation biology. He is a Reader in Evolutionary Ecology and Conservation at Royal Holloway University of London. **Prof. William Hughes** is our new Treasurer. Research in Bill's group focuses on the evolutionary biology of sociality, symbiosis and sex, and he has recently moved from the University of Leeds to the University of Sussex, where he is a Professor of Evolutionary Biology. **Dr. Elli Leadbeater** will take over as Secretary. Elli is currently a Leverhulme Early Career Research Fellow at the Institute of Zoology, where her research focuses on the cognitive basis of insect social behaviour. From June this year, she will take up a lectureship position at Queen Mary University of London.

While we're looking at many other things, the most immediate one, on which we would like your opinion, is the newsletters. Alternatively, we might make the spring newsletter a round-up of the Winter Meeting and any changes to Section rules, for those people who were not able to make it to the meeting, and keep the Autumn newsletter for lab news and info about the next Winter Meeting. ## Upcoming meetings

---

**IUSSI Northwest section 2013 Winter Meeting** will take place at Royal Holloway, University of London. It is currently planned to be a 2-day meeting, and will take place in the week starting 16th December. Further details will follow.

**Behaviour 2013** ([www.iec2013.com](http://www.iec2013.com)) is a joint meeting of the 33rd International Ethological Conference (IEC) and the Association for the Study of Animal Behaviour (ASAB). The conference will be held in Newcastle, UK between 4th and 8th August 2013. This will be the largest gathering of researchers working in the field of animal behaviour in 2013, and the focus spans Tinbergen's four questions: function (behavioural ecology), mechanism (cognition, neuroethology), development and phylogeny. Sharoni Shafir (Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Israel) is a plenary speaker, and the symposium "Sensation, Communication, and Foraging in Bees", organised by Natalie Hempel de Ibarra and Geraldine Wright, will be of particular interest to insect researchers.

**ESEB 2013** ([www.eseb2013.com](http://www.eseb2013.com)) is the 14<sup>th</sup> Congress of the European Society for Evolutionary Biology, and will take place in Lisbon, Portugal, from 19<sup>th</sup>-24<sup>th</sup> August 2013.

Relevant symposia include “The nature and mechanisms of evolution of species recognition systems”, “Genetics and genomics of host-parasite coevolution” and “Evolutionary consequences of deception”

**Apimondia 2013** ([www.apimondia2013.org.ua/en](http://www.apimondia2013.org.ua/en)) is the 43<sup>rd</sup> International Apicultural Congress, and will be held in Kyiv, Ukraine, from 29<sup>th</sup> September to 4<sup>th</sup> October 2013. A particular focus of the scientific programme will be “Beyond the Hive: Beekeeping and Global Challenges”. Abstract submissions are now open.

**INTECOL 2013** ([www.intecol2013.org](http://www.intecol2013.org)) will take place at ExCel, London, UK, from 18<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2013, combining the British Ecological Society's Annual Meeting with the 11th INTECOL Congress. Plenary speakers include Professor Tim Clutton-Brock and Professor Martin Nowak. Abstract submission is now open.
